June 2nd, 2020 - theory holds that concentrated poverty neighborhoods have serious and lasting consequences for their residents and that all other things being equal poor children who grow up in high poverty neighborhoods will experience significantly worse outes than poor children in more affluent munities

June 5th, 2020 - moreover the children of two generations of poor neighborhoods do much worse than those of two generations who managed to stay out of poor neighborhoods over half a standard deviation worse for technical reasons these statistical results probably underestimate the real effect of neighborhood poverty on scores

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children in persistent poverty urban institute

June 8th, 2020 - one in every five children currently lives in poverty but nearly twice as many experience poverty sometime during childhood using 40 years of data this analysis follows children from birth to age 17 then through their 20s to examine how childhood poverty and family and neighborhood characteristics relate to achievement in young adulthood such as pleting high school by age 20

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neighborhood characteristics and depression

April 15th, 2020 - neighborhoods with poor quality housing few resources and unsafe conditions impose stress which can lead to depression the stress imposed by adverse neighborhoods increases depression above and beyond the effects of the individual s own personal stressors such as poverty and negative events within the family or work place

June 6th, 2020 - in 1994 about 30 percent of british children lived in poverty by 2009 that figure had fallen by more than half to 12 percent meanwhile the us 2009 child poverty rate was almost 21 percent britain used three strategies to reduce its child poverty rate and to help poor children and their families in other ways
